

A Nation in Freefall:

The Humanitarian Catastrophe

Sudan’s war between the SAF and RSF has shattered its social fabric, turning Khartoum into a landscape of checkpoints and sniper fire. The conflict has created the world’s largest displacement crisis, with over 11 million uprooted. In Darfur, ethnically targeted killings recall past genocides.

The World Watches: Paralysis in Diplomacy

Despite the crisis’s severity, global diplomacy has stalled. Ceasefire talks in Jeddah and Manama collapse as both Burhan and Hemedti pursue battlefield legitimacy. The UN Security Council remains divided, while regional powers fuel a proxy war. Humanitarian aid is obstructed and looted, exposing a troubling failure of international conflict-resolution mechanisms.

A PLEBISCITE IS A DIRECT VOTE IN WHICH ALL ELIGIBLE CITIZENS OF A REGION ARE ASKED TO ACCEPT OR REJECT A SPECIFIC POLITICAL OR TERRITORIAL PROPOSAL.
